# PL & LTL 2024: The 9th International Symposium on Pedagogical Lexicography and L2 Teaching and Learning

The 9th International Symposium on Pedagogical Lexicography and Second Language Teaching and Learning (PL & LTL 2024) will be held from October 25 to 27, 2024 in Wuhan, China. PL & LTL 2024 centers on the evolving relationship among lexicography, L2 teaching and learning, and knowledge services in the dynamic Age of AI-Generated Content (AIGC). It is dedicated to promoting international dialogue on the latest advancements, emerging challenges, and future trends in pedagogical lexicography in an increasingly digital and post-dictionary world. The symposium will feature contributions by world-renowned academics, promoting dialogues among top lexicography theorists, practitioners, and publishers from both China and around the world.

## I. Theme

In line with the overarching theme, "Lexicography and Knowledge Services in the Age of AIGC", we invite submissions of high-quality empirical and theoretical research papers that cover a broad spectrum of topics, including but not limited to:

- 1. Pedagogical lexicography and language technologies (esp. use of Chatbots in dictionary-making)
- 2. Dictionary-integrated L2 pedagogy: theory and practice

- 3. Lexicography in the context of convergence media: theory and practice
- 4. Dictionary and dissemination of linguistic and non-linguistic knowledge
- 5. Reports on lexicographical and lexicological projects

## II. Timeline

- 1. Deadline for abstract submission: March 31, 2024
- 2. Notification of abstract acceptance: May 31, 2024
- 3. Deadline for full paper submission: August 30, 2024
- 4. Date of the conference: October 25-27, 2024 (Onsite Registration: October 24)

## **III. Submission Guidelines**

All papers must be original and not simultaneously submitted to another journal or conference. Please adhere to the following Submission Guidelines to ensure your work is considered:

1. Abstract Submission: The abstract, written in Chinese, English, or French, must not exceed 500 words (excluding references). It must also include the title of the article, and 3 to 5 keywords.

2. Submission Portal: Abstract submissions are accepted only electronically by using the online submission system: <u>https://plltl2024.sciencesconf.org</u> Paper submissions must be submitted in a form suitable for anonymous review.

3. **Review and Notification:** The Symposium's scientific committee will conduct a thorough review of all abstracts. Selected authors will receive formal invitations by May 31, 2024, with additional details about the Symposium. Authors with accepted abstracts are expected to submit their full papers by August 30, 2024.

4. **Full Paper Requirements:** The full paper should adhere to a limit of 7,000 Chinese characters (typed in Song font, size 5), or 5,000 English words (typed in Times New Roman, size 12), formatted single-spaced with numbered pages.

5. **Reference Style:** For the preparation of submissions, authors are required to adhere strictly to the referencing style as outlined by the *International Journal of Lexicography*.
